Aurora District United Methodist Women Annual Celebration

Virtual Event
Saturday, September 26, 2020
Minutes

President Betty Erickson opened the virtual meeting at 9 am by welcoming all in attendance and establishing Zoom etiquette. She reminded attendees that all necessary District forms and due dates were included in the program booklet.

Erica McIntosh provided a devotion from the Message based on Romans 4:19-21. Do we tiptoe or plunge in our faith walk?

Prior to reading from the Prayer Calendar, Betty acknowledged all special guests and past officers, thanking them for their service and attendance. She provided the opening prayer, closing with the UMW Purpose.

Gail Helland gave the Response moment, noting that Northern Illinois Conference had been highlighted for making and distributing masks. Her book review of Which Way God from the current reading list included 2 new definitions for GPS: God's Positioning System and Gifts, Passion, Style. All current books are available on the UMW website.

Phyllis Pepiot introduced Pastor Esther Holiday, founder of Love Outreach Center (LOC). Pastor Holiday noted that her passion for this organization stemmed from the fact that she was trafficked at age 17.

Kara Doan spoke about Restoration 61 whose mission is to provide hope and dignity to victims of sex trafficking. A recent survey noted that sex trafficking is the second largest criminal enterprise netting over \$32 billion. In 2004 it was estimated that 16,000-25,000 would be trafficked in the Chicago region, most sold between 15-40 times daily. The average age of a victim was 12-14, found through social networks, home neighborhoods, clubs, bars, Internet or school. Signs of a trafficked victim were noted, but intervention is not recommended. Local authorities should be notified immediately. The national hotline is 1-888-373-7888.

Following a brief break, Betty called the Annual Business Meeting and Pledge service to order at 10:10. Following a motion by Phyllis and second by Emmy Lou John, minutes from 2019 were approved as written.

Chyrlie Soltau presented the 2021 Budget, which was approved following a brief discussion to note the opportunity to exceed this year's reduced budget. The Pledge service was led by Chyrlie with attendee participation.

Donna Szoke read the proposed 2021 slate of officers: President-Betty Erickson 2nd year, 1st term; Vice President-Phyllis Pepiot 2nd year, 2nd term; Secretary-Pam Stare 1st year, 2nd term; Treasurer-Chyrlie Soltau 1st year, 2nd term; Communications-Anita Young 2nd year, 1st term; Spiritual Growth- Charlotte Wyncoop 1st year, 1st term; Social Action-Nadia Kanhai 1st year, 1st term; Education and Interpretation- Aija Borkland 2nd year, 2nd term; Membership- Gail Helland 1st year, 2nd term; Class of 2021 nominations- Donna Szoke. Emmy Johns moved to accept the proposed slate. It was approved.

Erica installed elected officers using individual Bible verses. She began the worship service with centering words followed by the call to worship and an opening prayer. Mark 12:28-34 was the scripture preceding the message entitled Simple Gifts. Erica noted that we all have gifts, but may have forgotten how to share them. The worship service ended with the dedication of gifts, offertory prayer and closing hymn.

Betty closed the meeting at 11:10 thanking all in attendance.

Membership Report




Stay Connected and Informed with Faith Talks

When our district President Betty Erickson called me and asked me to be the Spiritual Growth Coordinator, it caught me by surprise. I had been recommended by someone I had met in Lay Academy.

A theme that God keeps pounding into my head over the years is that he doesn't call the equipped, he equips the called. I haven't been a member of UMW, our church hasn't had a unit in years. After explaining all my deficiencies Betty, I hung up and God was knocking on my heart. I've heard Him knocking before and He always wins in the end. No matter what arguments I came up with the next week and there were lots of them, I knew it was pretty useless. For some reason, He wanted me to do this...SOOO... I should get my act together and say

yes. While Betty was sympathetic and I think probably secretly delighted, I was still rolling my eyes at God and asking what on earth am I supposed to do?

I am a stay at home Mom of four kids - they are 17,15, 13, and 11. My oldest daughter is in Sweden at the moment on foreign exchange - yes, even during Covid. My kids are in school hybrid—part of the time at school and part time e-learning. Because I've been an at-home Mom, I've been able to return to my
