Greetings,




Nominations Report

Embracing Wonder in These Times of Change

As a child, I used to sit at my grandfather's feet and listen to his stories of how much the world has changed. He was born in 1915 in Southern Illinois on a farm with no running water or electricity. The outhouse stood behind the house, and during snow, sleet or rain, you walked back there to do your business. They buried their apple harvest in the fields tucked into mounds of hay and plowed under using their team of horses. He used to say the winter apples were better than any store bought apples he has ever had since—crisp and juicy and bursting with flavor. His family finally got a car when he was a teenager. He survived the Spanish Flu Pandemic. He experienced the Great Depression. He served in World War II in three theaters as a minesweeper. He watched Neil Armstrong walk on the Moon. My Dad and Grandpa had written a genealogy book the old-fashioned way: visiting churches, graveyards and courthouse and digging through microfiche and paper records. Grandpa lived to see Ancestry.com emerge. He died in 2003, just a month before my son was born.

As we watch the pandemic change our world, as we get ready to change UMW districts, I wonder what he would think of the changes we're experiencing? He always talked about those experiences with a sense of wonder. He would shake his head and smile as if he felt like the luckiest person alive to have seen and experienced all those changes throughout his life. He would talk about wisdom and just being careful to do the things you knew to do and he would smile and say that God put him where he was needed.

Often we fuss over the changes in our lives. We vent and whine because change is hard and uncomfortable. The Israelites were slaves in Egypt, and yet again and again they complained about getting rescued. "The quail and manna are boring. Our feet hurt. We're thirsty. Did you bring us out here to kill us???" Today, with masks versus no masks, to vaccinate or not to vaccinate, stay at home orders and shortages, it feels sometimes like we're the Israelites, and the pandemic is the desert. God offers us his presence and we'd rather focus on what we don't have.

But our God offers us healing and hope, freedom and growth and like the Israelites, we do step out in faith. We watch the miracles, we know the good that is coming because our God has a plan and a purpose and Jesus, our redeemer and healer, is here with us just like the pillar of fire and the pillar of cloud led the Israelites. We're walking into new territory, new districts. We'll meet new people and have fresh opportunities. Let's face it with a sense of wonder, of expectancy. When the Old Testament's Joshua and his scouts came back, they brought back huge grapes and tales of a land of plenty that God was giving them. Many of the scouts were afraid, but Joshua trusted that God knew what he was doing and would use it to bless his people.

This coming year, let's all be like Joshua. Let's face this new territory, the new challenges with a sense of wonder and expectancy. God doesn't want us to be slaves tied into old patterns and old ways of doing things. He's bringing us into a new phase of life with new challenges and wants to bless us. Let's meet new friends, and cherish our old ones while holding on to the best parts of what we do as a district and blending it with the best parts others bring to our new locations. We are one people in Christ Jesus, women who want to make a difference in this new world that lies before us. Let us claim this time of change with a sense of wonder and expectancy and walk with Jesus into it expecting great things.

Membership Report



In April, we discussed <u>Gum Moon</u>, dealing with the struggles of Asian women living in San Francisco during the 1906 earthquake. Following a toddler given up to a brothel by a poor starving family for enough money to support the other members, the book makes you want more even after finishing it.

The second book, <u>#notyourprincess</u>, is a collection of poems, art, and short essays written by indigenous women. While reading this, I recalled a previous book, <u>Tilly and the Crazy Eights</u>, which dealt with the same topics of concern, alcoholism, rape, and poor treatment of children at the resident reservation schools.

The reading list books open one's eyes to the world around us that one doesn't see on the nightly news but is so worthy of several news stories. The readings also help to understand how vital our mission dollars are for so many to improve their lives.

Here is a quick set of tips you may find helpful and the questions you will be asked.

- 1. At the top of the page, you will see a box. The easiest way to find your church is to enter your church's zip code, then the search icon, then "Select" your church. That will populate some answers for you.
- 2. You will need to enter your "Unit Name." Be specific: First UMW, Morris or Wesley UMW Aurora, IL. Believe it or not, there are more than one "First United Methodist Church", "St. Andrew UMC", etc., and there are a lot of units with "UMW" in the title: include your church name and if it doesn't include your city, add that, too.
- 3. For "Unit mailing address", put in your church address.
- 4. For "Unit type", 99% of replies in Aurora District will be "local." Choosing your language should be pretty clear.
- 5. Enter your president's information (name, phone number, email).
- 6. Enter number of members added Jan 1, 2021 to Dec. 31, 2021, enter number of members lost by death or other reasons, and then the total number of active members as of Dec. 31, 2021. Don't stress over these numbers, a good guess is much better than not completing the survey.
- 7. Fill in the contact information for the person who completed the report for your unit.
- 8. There are additional questions, some with drop-down boxes from which to choose your response.

Average age of unit members? Are you an active unit? Considering becoming inactive? If so, names of those who might want to remain active? Why are you becoming inactive? Category for your unit (from a drop-down box) Mission u studies?

International missions? Source of information?

How do you wish to receive resources? Giving?

Service and Advocacy? How have you met during the pandemic?

It sounds like a lot and looks like it will take a long time, but it's really just choosing which answer best describes your unit. Just answer best you can.

United Methodist Women Celebrates New Juneteenth Federal Holiday

United Methodist Women acknowledges with gratitude the signing into law of the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act, adopted with overwhelming bipartisan support in both houses of Congress. The new federal holiday commemorates June 19, 1865, the day when enslaved African Americans in Galveston, Texas, learned they were freed by the Emancipation Proclamation, two years after President Abraham Lincoln signed it into law. Juneteenth, also known as Black Independence Day and Day of Jubilee, is American history not taught in most U.S. public schools. This event, the Tulsa Race Massacre, and many other currently omitted parts of our history must be included in the curriculum so that we as Americans know our full story, the struggles of our forebearers that brought us to where we are today, and the

work we must do today to live into our national pledge of liberty and justice for all.

The bipartisan support for the Juneteenth federal holiday is an encouraging sign that our leaders are open to acknowledging our nation's true history — in its full racial diversity, injustices and all — which is a requisite part our ongoing journey to create a more perfect union together. As women of faith, we know the importance of telling the whole story as a foundation for making needed changes in our own community and in the broader society. We pray that the Juneteenth federal holiday will undergird our nation's commitment to the ongoing work for racial justice. Our faith in Jesus' promise that "the truth will set you free" helps us persist in this work — even when the whole story is difficult to face. May this be a step toward policies that ensure racial justice.

Apply for Funding for a Just Energy For All Campaign

The Office of Economic and Environmental Justice invites United Methodist Women groups to apply for grants to help support local organizing campaigns to advance just energy for all. Funding is available for work happening at the circle, unit, district, conference or jurisdiction

level. United Methodist Women groups are strongly encouraged to apply for a grant to support work that is happening collaboratively — in coalition/partnership with other organizations or groups — so long as such work involves substantial participation from local United Methodist Women members. Collaborating with other organizations and groups is strongly encouraged.

About the Just Energy for All Campaign

Our Just Energy for All Campaign works for energy that is cleaner and more just for all of God's people and creation. The means advocating for 100% renewable energy (RE) – such as solar, wind, small-scale hydro and geothermal – that is centered on justice and equity.

Goal of UMW Grant Support

The goal is to support United Methodist Women's efforts to advance just energy for all by providing small scale grants to deepen existing campaigns and/or develop new campaigns.

Available Grant Support

Consideration will be given to funding requests of \$100 – \$5,000. Applicants should carefully consider the amount of funding needed and to document the budget and the rationale in the application. Funding is limited, so please budget responsibly and request only the amount that you will need. Requests for funding in excess of \$5,000 will not be considered.

Criteria for Evaluating Applications

Many United Methodist Women groups are doing wonderful work in a variety of areas – awareness-building, direct services, education, Bible Study, prayer groups and more. However, this funding support is specifically designated for organizing and campaign work. Such work may also include some component of direct service provision, Bible Study, awareness-building, etc., but it must include an organizing/campaign component. Your campaign should have a clear goal or target – e.g. a concrete change in practice or policy – that will address the climate crisis and advance just energy for all.

Campaigns must show that they include the voices of directly impacted communities in the leadership and/or decision-making process. Depending on your specific context and campaign, directly impacted communities could include fence-line and frontline communities near power plants, mining, fracking areas and highly polluted areas, communities with high energy burden, those with health conditions impacted by climate change, or workers in the current energy industry.


